A Letter from the Supervisor



Spring is within sight!

Now that we have turned the corner and are heading into spring, I want to remind our residents of some of the services that are available.

Once again, yard waste collection will take place every week starting Friday, April 5. This weekly collection by Republic Services will continue through the remainder of the 2024 calendar year, with the final collection taking place on Saturday, December 28, due to Republic Services observance of Christmas.

The entire 2024 Fenton Township Republic Services brochure is accessible on the Township website, and printed copies can be picked up at the reception desk. The six-page brochure includes information on which items can be recycled or placed at the curb for yard waste collection, along with the recycling map and 2024 collection calendar.

Spring also means that mosquitos will begin to make their annual appearance.

Fenton Township's contract with APM Mosquito Control for Township-wide mosquito treatment includes the ability for residents to call APM at 810.766.9423 and request treatments for their yard up to three times in the calendar year.

This is a fantastic service to schedule ahead when preparing for any open house or other outdoor celebration this summer.

Additionally, residents can contact APM and request to be added to their call list for notification prior to mosquito fogging in their area.

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Southern Lakes Water Extension Project Update

Progress is ongoing for the Southern Lakes Water Extension.

In February, the Genesee
County Road Commission
closed northbound traffic on
Torrey Road between
Lahring Road and
Thompson Road to start
construction on Phase II.

The Torrey Road portion of the project is projected to wrap up, and allow the reopening of northbound traffic on Torrey Road, in May, weather permitting.

Following the work on Torrey Road, Phase II will continue west on the southside of Lahring Road.

This summer, Phase II will connect with construction from Phase III at the Lahring Road and Jennings Road intersection.

Phase III has already started on Ripley Road at boarder with the City of Linden and is progressing north towards Lahring Road.

Phase III construction will continue east on the southside of Lahring Road.

Phase II and Phase III will come together at the Lahring Road and Jennings Road intersection near the Lake Fenton High School.

Phase II will then continue north on Jennings Road to Thompson Road.

Construction impacts on traffic for Lahring and Jennings roads are still in the planning stage.

As information from the county becomes available, we will update the Southern Lakes Extension page on the Fenton Township website and publish the information on the Official Fenton Township social media channels (X, Facebook, Instagram, and Nextdoor).


Phase II and III Maps Available

Who is Eligible?

The following requirements apply:

- · Must own and occupy the home for at least one year prior to applying
- Must meet income limits set by the federal government
- Must be current on property tax, mortgage, and homeowners insurance payments
- Existing mortgage cannot exceed value of the home
- Needed improvements must be eligible within the Program guidelines
