

Surface Water & Storm Water

Only storm water should flow into storm drains. Storm drains empty into our local lakes and rivers.

Don't dump household cleaners, RV waste, etc. into storm drains, as the sewage will end up in our local lakes and river and contaminate the ground water that the wells in Fenton Township pull water from.

Not to mention it is illegal to dump sewage into storm drains.

Storm Drains

Storm drains are largely the responsibility of two Genesee County Agencies.
